Access to symposium

Format and operation of the symposium

Symposium S1 will be held in two slots of oral presentations:

Thursday September 3, from 8:15 to 11:00

Friday September 4, From 8:15 to 12:20

The oral presentations are of three types and have the following duration:

2 Keynotes: 2 (20 min + 10 min of live Q&A)

4 Invited Lectures: 4 (10 min + 10 min of live Q&A)

12 Regular Oral Presentations: (10 min + 10 min of live Q&A)

The selected platform for the online development of Symposium S1 is Zoom (access protected with password).

All the presentations have been pre-recorded by the presenters to minimize technical problems). Each oral presentation will be projected as scheduled in the Symposium S1 Program. Immediately after each presentation, there will be a 10-min live Q&A session with the presenter and moderated by the corresponding chairman using the 'rise hand' option in Zoom. In addition, the written chat in Zoom will be open for more questions. The chat will be also used for questions outside the fixed time (10 min). The chat will be recorded and sent to the presenter for the own managing (if possible and desired) of the answers via personal email.
